Live Music Makes a Return to Roslyn

Next Wednesday, July 28, the Village of Roslyn will hold its first outdoor music concert in over a decade. On that date, the group Squeaky Clean will perform a concert, “Roslyn Rocks The Park” at Gerry Park on Roslyn Road, one that will begin at 6 p.m. The park will be open that evening from 4:30 to 9 p.m. Rain date is Wednesday, Aug. 4.

The concert is the result of lobbying by the revitalized Roslyn Chamber of Commerce, which secured permission from the Town of North Hempstead’s Parks Department to hold the concert.

“There hasn’t been a live concert in the park held in Roslyn in over 10 years,” noted Chamber President Lonnie Goldman, who praised Lou Federico, the chamber’s vice president of events and former Roslyn Mayor Janet Galante, plus the entire Events Committee for making the show a reality.
